

THE HIGHWAYS AGENCY**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 -****SECTION 14****THE M65 MOTORWAY (JUNCTIONS 8-10
EASTBOUND CARRIAGEWAY AND JUNCTION 8
EASTBOUND ENTRY SLIP ROAD)****(TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC)****ORDER 2010**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of State for Transport intends to make an Order on the M65 Motorway in the Borough of Burnley in the County of Lancashire to enable resurfacing, road stud replacement and marking works to be carried out in safety.

The effect of the Order is to ban all traffic from the eastbound carriageway of the M65 Motorway between Junctions 8 and 10 from the last point where the Junction 8 exit slip road leaves the carriageway to the first point where the Junction 10 entry slip road joins the carriageway.

The effect of the Order is to ban all traffic from the entry slip road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the M65 Motorway at Junction 8.

The works are expected to take place over two nights between 2200 hours and 0500 hours during a period starting on Monday 2 August 2010 and ending on Monday 9 August 2010. However, if necessary, work may start and continue between the same times on subsequent nights or continue until completed.

Traffic travelling eastbound will be directed to leave the M65 Motorway at Junction 8 and then travel on the A56, the A679 (Accrington Road) and the A671 (Cavalry Way) to join the M65 eastbound carriageway at Junction 10.

Traffic wishing to join the eastbound carriageway of the M65 Motorway at Junction 8 will be directed to travel around the roundabout and join the A56 southbound. Traffic will then follow the above diversion route.

The prohibitions will apply only during such times and to such extent as will be indicated by traffic signs and will not apply to vehicles being used in connection with the works or by traffic officers, or to vehicles being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue or ambulance services.

The Order comes in to force on 1 August 2010 and has a maximum duration of eighteen months.
